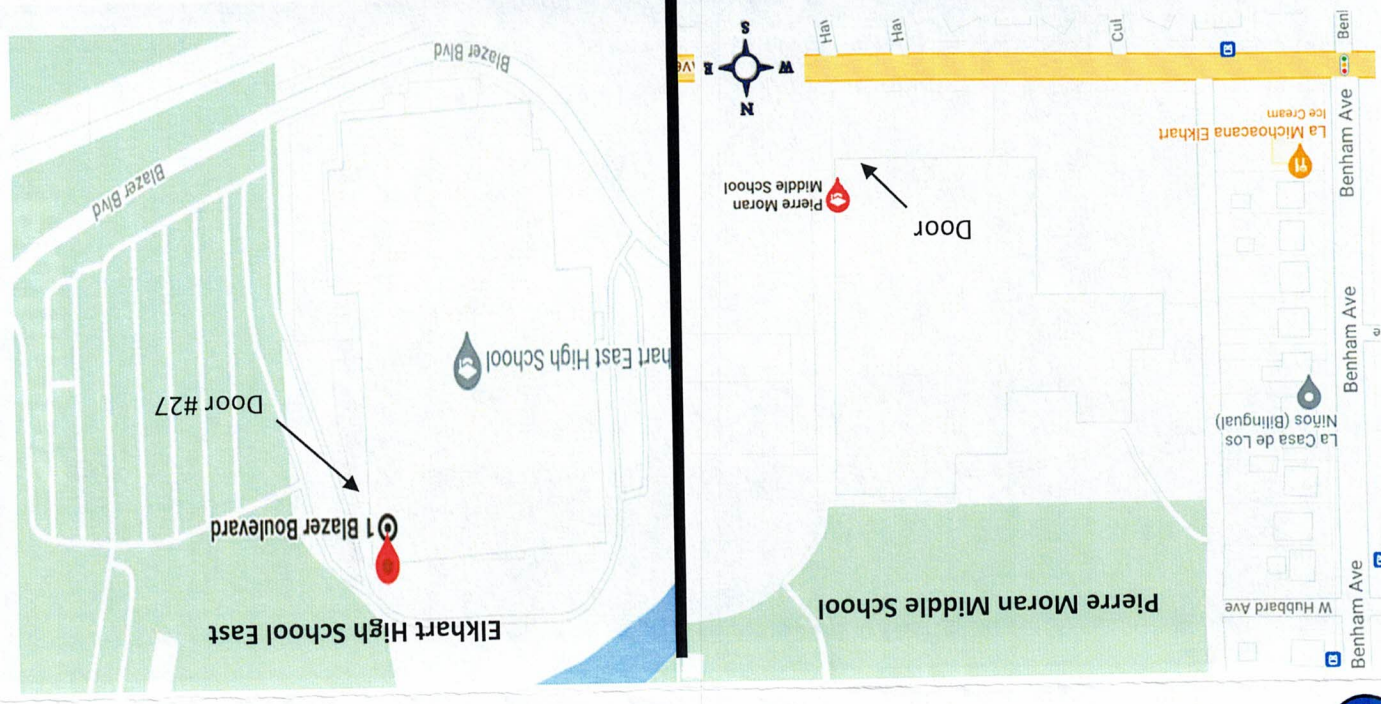
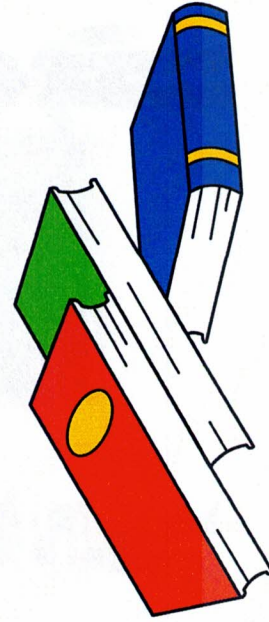
High School Equivalency (HSE) & ELL Classes

Elkhart Community Schools offers free classes for adults that are interested in attaining an HSE diploma, improving basic skills, learning English as a second language, or attaining training and certifications in workforce preparation skills.

Anyone looking to enroll in HSE or ELL classes must call the Community Education office and be registered for orientation and placement. Everyone must attend a three or four day orientation and be pretested prior to beginning class.

Completion time of the program varies by individual student. Sixteen and seventeen year olds must have an **Exit Interview Form** from their home high school AND meet with a staff member in the office, by appointment only, to enroll in classes.

No one under the age of 18 is permitted to enroll in our ELL classes per the state of Indiana.

Program Policies

We look forward to helping you achieve your goals for education and employment. There are several policies you will need to follow to participate in our program.

Attendance: Students will sign an attendance agreement stating that they plan to attend class every day it is offered. Students must report all absences to the instructor prior to missing class accompanied by a valid excuse.

Communication with Instructor: Please let your instructor know if you are struggling with studies or have issues hindering your class attendance. The instructors are here to support you!

Class Arrival/Departure: Students are expected to arrive to class on time and remain until the end of the class or be dismissed by the instructor.

Dress Code: Students are to dress appropriately for a work setting when coming to class. (Sagging pants, pajamas, slippers, hats, low cut or midriff-showing tops etc., are all inappropriate for class.) No hoods are to be worn in class.

Cell Phone Usage: Students are to turn off or silence their cell phone during class time. If there is an emergency call, please communicate the situation with your instructor and step outside of the classroom.
